- I created this course for the Guatemala study abroad tours in summer and fall 2014. The course focuses on the Economic development of Guatemala, current issues in Guatemala's economic development and prospects for the future.

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##### **International Development Internship Program Seminar- (INIP4000-01)**

- This Seminar course has been completely redesigned by me. INIP4000 is the first class that the IDIP cohort takes before embarking upon their internships in winter (INIP4010) and subsequent return in spring (INIP4020). The course provides an in-depth investigation of the challenges, questions and approaches to field of International Development in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Focused on global poverty, the course examines the several ways that have been proposed by the international development community in combating poverty. We examine the role of governments, social businesses and NGOs and discuss alternate theoretical perspectives proposed by academics on international development issues and problems particular to developing economies covering topics such as food, health, family planning and microloans. Several guest speakers ( 9 in all this past fall 2014) help students connect development theory and approaches with actors and agents working in the space.
